Sarasota, Fla.--David Hartley, of Wheatland, has successfully completed his first year as a member of the Charter Class of New College, Sarasota, Fla. New College opened its doors in September 1964 as an eleven-month, three-year liberal arts college.

Hartley will major in pre-medicine when he returns late in September following a five-week vacation-study period. Upon completing year-end examinations Hartley said, "I found that I had learned more than I thought I had during the year. Somehow learning seems to 'creep up on you' and what were only words in the beginning, especially in unfamiliar fields, took on meaning as the year progressed. The comprehensive exams tended to illustrate to me what I had learned.

Dave was the moving force in establishing a New College Blood Bank at the local hospital, reported for the school newspaper, THE CATALYST, and was a student auditor of the Summer Music Festival sponsored by New College. "This was my first close exposure to fine music and outstanding musicians. I really enjoyed the music and found that I was following the score with the musicians. It was a wonderful experience. The personal contact with great musicians was a real thrill for me."

Hartley also studied art because he decided he should know something about it. "Having the Ringling Museum close at hand helped so much. Reading about a piece of sculpture or a painting is helpful, but to be able to go right over and see the real thing made it truly meaningful and exciting," he said.
