A California physicist has been appointed to the faculty of New College as Professor of Physics.

Dr. Earl W. Friesen, now on the faculty at San Francisco State College and teaching this summer at the University of California, joins the New College faculty in September.

Dr. Friesen earned his doctorate at the University of California at Berkeley in the field of physics with special emphasis on cosmic radiation and high energy nuclear physics. While working on his doctorate he was awarded a Westinghouse Fellowship. He also had earned his undergraduate degree at the University.

In addition to teaching at San Francisco State College where he has been since 1961, the physicist was a member of the faculty of Indiana University for five years. During 1963 he taught Peace Corps students and he has served as a consultant to a California school district in a special demonstration school and also for the University of California Science Curriculum Improvement Study.

Dr. Friesen was elected a member of Phi Beta Kappa at the university and after graduation was elected a fellow of the American Physical Society. He also has served as an officer of the American Assn. of Physics Teachers in both Indiana and California and during the past year was president of the Northern California section.

Dr. Friesen is married and has two young sons.
