YOUR AREA STUDENTS AND FACULTY HEAR EMINENT HISTORIAN

Sarasota, Fla. -- A delegation of teachers and students from  
visited the campus of New College Saturday, March 13, and heard a  
special lecture by renowned historian Dr. Arnold J. Toynbee.

Dr. Toynbee, considered the world's foremost living historian,  
spoke to approximately 500 students and teachers invited from 180  
colleges, universities, and secondary schools in Florida.

Topic of the talk, which was given in the open courtyard of the  
Ringling Museum of Art adjacent to New College, was "Why Study  
History."

Dr. Toynbee is Visiting Professor of History at New College,  
which opened as a college of the liberal arts and sciences in September  
with a charter class of 100 students.
