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A New College faculty recital, with violinist Paul Wolfe, pianist Jacques Abram, and oboist Miss Patricia Stenberg, will be held in College Hall Monday evening at 8 o'clock.

This is one of several concerts to be given by the faculty for the college community during the year.

The Monday concert marks the first time since the New College Summer Music Festival that the three artists have had the opportunity to perform together.

The program will include three numbers performed by Professors Wolfe and Abram, Mozart's Sonata No. 4 in E Major, Brahms' Sonata in G Major, and Mozart's Sonata No. 15 in B Flat. Miss Stenberg will join them in the performance of a Trio Sonata in G Major.

The concert comes only a few days before Professor Abram leaves for Europe for a concert and recording tour.

Professor Wolfe participates regularly in the academic program at New College, working with students in humanities seminars as well as teaching beginning piano and coaching a woodwind quintet.

Professor Abram leads a seminar for advanced pianists at the college while Miss Stenberg regularly meets with a class in the study of music.
