PRESIDENT 'PROGRESSING SATISFACTORILY'

Dr. Elmendorf's physicians said at 8:30 a.m. today that he continues to progress satisfactorily toward recovery. He remains in serious condition in the intensive care unit of the cardiac section of Sarasota Memorial Hospital.

The President suffered a heart attack during the faculty meeting on Wednesday, September 18, at approximately 3:45 p.m. He left the meeting to be chaired by Dr. William Hamilton, Professor of Religion and went to the Office of Student Policy, complaining of severe discomfort in his chest and shoulder. Fran LeMasters, R.N., examined him and suggested that an ambulance be called. Dr. Elmendorf was taken to Sarasota Memorial and admitted to the intensive care unit of the cardiac section.

Mary Elmendorf, the President's wife, was leaving the hospital at 8:30 p.m. last night when the car she was a passenger in was struck from behind. The car was being driven by Mrs. Elizabeth Stephens, a close friend of Mrs. Elmendorf. Both Mrs. Stephens and Mrs. Elmendorf suffered whiplash injuries, but were x-rayed and noting serious was found. They were asked to stay at the hospital overnight and are expected to be released today.

STUDENT GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS ON MONDAY

The elections for the Student Executive Committee, SEC chairman, and Student Court will be held Monday in the Reception Center from 1 to 6 p.m. The early elections are due in part to President Elmendorf's illness. It was felt at the SEC meeting Wednesday night that it would be in the best interests of the college to have a full college council and SEC inoperation as soon as possible.

Petitions should be submitted to John Esak in room 116 before midnight Sunday, September 22. Students wishing to be placed on the ballot for the SEC must have their petitions signed by 15% of their class. Students who wish to run for SEC chairman must have signatures of 5% of the Student Body.
