Ten firms submitted bids on Phase I of the East Campus of New College Friday.

Low base bid was submitted by the firm of H.L. Coble Construction Co. of Orlando with a figure of \$1,933,000.

College officials indicated that it would be some time before a decision would be made known on the bids. There were 15 alternates on each bid.

Bids were on the three dormitories which will house the first students at New College.

Plans for the East Campus were drawn by the firm of I.M. Pei & Associates of New York. Eason Leonard, a partner in the firm, opened the bids at 4 p.m. Friday in College Hall on campus.

The firms and their bids: H.L. Coble, Orlando, \$1,933,000; Mills & Jones, St. Petersburg, \$1,987,000; James A. Knowles, St. Petersburg, \$2,020,000; C.A. Fieland, Tampa, \$2,025,000; Cooper Tull Mindarzi, Tampa, \$2,035,000; Smith & Sapp, Orlando, \$2,083,800; M.R. Harrison, Miami, \$2,086,370; Pan American Engineering & Construction, Orlando, \$2,096,000; Fred Howland, Inc., Miami, \$2,145,000; Moore Construction, St. Petersburg, \$2,199,453.

Included in the bids were three courts which constitute the housing complex for students. The entire ~~campus~~ East Campus is situated east of U.S. 41 from the bayfront campus which houses present campus buildings.
