Sarasota, Florida--Dallas W. Dort, a former United States Department of State official, has been named a trustee of New College.

Dort, a native of Flint, Michigan and now owner of a 3,000 acre cattle ranch in Sarasota, was active as director of Central Administrative Services of the Office for Emergency Management during World War II.

After the war, he participated in the development and presentation to Congress of the Marshall Plan, was a member of the special United Nations Committee on Relief Needs and took part in the organization of and was the first U. S. representative of the Council of UNICEF. Dort was the U. S. representative on and chairman of the Supply Committee of the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration.

The New College trustee was graduated from Princeton University and earned his law degree at the University of Michigan.

New College opens for its first classes in the fall of this year as an independent, private, coeducational college of the liberal arts and sciences.
