Dr. George F. Baughman, president of New College, has accepted an invitation to become a member of the American Council on Education (ACE) Commission on Administrative Affairs.

The invitation was extended by Dr. Logan Wilson, president of ACE, and is for a three year term.

The Commission on Administrative Affairs presently is concerned with a major study of institutional autonomy, development of a statement on the respective roles of trustees, administrative officers and faculty members in college and university guidance, and revision of the special volumes issued by the Council and entitled, "College and University Business Administration."

Under the directorship of Edward L. Katzenbach, Jr., the Commission also is interested in such matters as program budgeting and the use of computers in college administration. Dr. John D. Millett, director and chancellor of the Ohio Board of Regents is chairman of the Commission.

Dr. Baughman has been active in educational administration for nearly 20 years in both public and private institutions.

He is the first president of New College and has served in that capacity for four years. For six years prior to that he was with the world's largest private university, New York University, as vice president for business affairs and treasurer.

From 1945 until 1955 he served the University of Florida, first as business manager and then as vice president for business affairs. He also taught there in the college of business administration.

For a number of years Dr. Baughman has served on the Institute for College and University Business Officers held annually at the University of Kentucky and he has written a number of articles for professional publications on various aspects of college and university administration ranging from publication of annual reports to student housing.

Dr. Baughman will attend a Commission meeting in Washington, D. C. April 28.
