Sarasota, Fla.--Thomas Lawson, of Spencer, Iowa, will return to New College, Sarasota, Fla., in September for his second year because "It has been a very valuable year. The experience in learning which we have here has given me attitudes and insights that I doubt that I would have received anywhere else."

Lawson is a member of the charter class of New College which opened its doors last September as an eleven-month, three-year liberal arts college. He successfully completed his first year on August 18 and following year-end examinations, will spend a five-week vacation-study period at his home.

Among other meetings of interest, Lawson attended the seminar held by famed historian, Dr. Arnold J. Toynbee, about which he commented, "Dr. Toynbee had an unusual view on modern life. His was a broadening influence and introduced me to a wider view of today's world."

Lawson also attended the Psychology and Ethics Seminars and thought that Dr. Berggren, Philosophy professor and leader of the two seminars, "was invigorating and easy to work for."

"New College," said Lawson, "has given me an insight which will continue to influence my thinking. It has given me an education rather than a training -- an attitude that I can apply to my daily living. Attitude, I think, is education."

Lawson will return to New College in late September when he will begin his major in Literature.
