Sarasota, Florida -- Florida's first summer music festival featuring chamber music will be held for eight days on the New College campus here beginning Sunday, July eleventh.

New College has brought seven artists here, one from as far away as Spain to serve on the faculty.

Paul Wolfe, conductor of the Florida West Coast Symphony, is the director and will teach violin. Others on the faculty are Walter Trampler, viola; Bernard Greenhouse, cello; Robert Bloom, oboe; Jacques Abram, piano; Gaston Dufresne, double bass; Patricia Stenberg, woodwinds.

During the eight days, four concerts will be offered to participating students, auditors, and the general public. The first is a recital by pianist Jacques Abram on the opening day.

During the week there will be workshops, seminars, and group performances while the Festival will be climaxed by three concerts by the faculty and a chamber orchestra Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, July 16, 17, 18.

Violist Trampler is flying here from his summer home in Majorca, off the coast of Spain. Other artists are coming from New York, Indiana, Connecticut, and from the Tampa Bay area.
