Nearly 500 teachers and students from colleges, universities, and high schools from around the state will gather in the Ringling Museum Courtyard Saturday morning to hear New College Visiting Professor of History Dr. Arnold J. Toynbee.

The talk by Dr. Toynbee that is attracting visitors here is, "Why Study History?"

Invitations went out to 33 institutions of higher education and a large number of the high schools around the state. Interested students and faculty were asked to attend.

Registrants for the lecture, which will begin at 11 a.m., are expected to begin arriving early Saturday morning from as far away as Miami and Cape Kennedy.

Following a 50 minute talk by the eminent historian in the Museum courtyard, a limited number of questions will be allowed from those attending the lecture.
