Sarasota - Florida West Coast residents will have an opportunity to be among the first to see the premiere tour of an exciting, new Korean children's folk dance group November 7 in Sarasota's Municipal Auditorium.

The Little Angels, a company of 26 Korean girls between the ages of seven and thirteen, in training in Korea for three years, are making their first American tour this fall. Their only appearance on Florida's West Coast will be in Sarasota under the sponsorship of The Friends of New College.

The Little Angels bring with them many gorgeous changes of costume, exotic stage props, and fascinating ancient instruments, plus a dance tradition extending back into antiquity.

Appearing with The Little Angels will be both the ambassador to the United States and the ambassador at large of the Republic of Korea. A scholarship will be offered for a qualified student from Korea to attend New College.

Appearance of the folk dance group was arranged by L. W. Horning, president of The Friends of New College and also a vice president of the Korean Cultural and Freedom Foundation of which former Presidents Truman and Eisenhower are honorary presidents.
