Two New College first year students debate a team from the Gibbs Campus of St. Petersburg Junior College Friday (April 29) at 7 p.m. in College Hall.

Dan Haggarty of Chippewa Falls, Wisconsin, and Patricia Sanderson of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., represent New College in the first of the two planned debates on the topic, "Resolved that law enforcement agencies in the United States should be given greater freedom in the investigation and prosecution of crime."

In the first debate, the New College team takes the negative side of the question and one week later in St. Petersburg, it debates the same question on the affirmative side.

The debates were arranged by Dr. Patricia J. Drabik, Assistant Professor of Speech and Dramatics at New College.

Haggarty was a high school varsity debater and his team in 1962 won the Wisconsin championship. He was a two-time gold medalist in extemporaneous speaking and was Wisconsin Catholic War Veterans Oratorical Champion.

Miss Sanderson was a member of her high school debate team and she placed first in extemporaneous speaking contests two years in the Diocese of Miami.
