New College is preparing to welcome its third and largest entering class on September 6.

Present indications are that the new class will number 106 students, according to Robert J. Norwine, Dean of Admissions. The first class -- admitted in September, 1964 -- had 101 students, and the class that entered last September had 95.

Because of last minute changes in plans, the total for the new class may vary slightly from the present figure by the time the students arrive to register, Dean Norwine said.

"This is our third outstanding class in a row," Dean Norwine said. "As in the past, we have been able to select young men and women whose secondary school records show them to be among the very best in the country."

The new class is drawn from 33 states and one foreign country, with the largest single state delegation being the 16 students from Florida. Two of the Floridians come from Sarasota.

In the new class there will be 61 boys and 45 girls. This is approximately the ratio that has been in effect since the college opened.

In the interest of obtaining the best qualified students, New College has continued its policy of assuring some degree of financial aid for about three-fourths of the members of the new class. A number of the new students will benefit from scholarship gifts and grants provided by friends of the college.
