New College student Steve Waterman will give a public lecture-concert of electronic Music Friday at 8 p.m., in the music room of College Hall.

Waterman, a first-year student at New College, spent his independent study period in the spring visiting the Columbia-Princeton Electronic Music Center and doing his research there.

He has brought together a variety of sounds produced electronically and has put them on tapes which he will play and then will describe their meaning and also how they were produced.

Waterman also has two tapes which were composed by programming a digital computer.

Some of the demonstrations the student will play for the audience include how ordinary sounds can be converted into music. In one tape sequence the sound of a drop of water falling is varied to make an unusual composition.

Waterman came to New College from East Point, Georgia, where he was president of the student body, on the executive board of the Georgia Association of Student Councils, and a member of the wrestling team.

The lecture is open to the public without charge and the audience will have an opportunity to ask questions at the conclusion of the program.
