The second of the New College Summer Music Festival Concerts will be performed tonight (Friday, June 24) at the Florida West Coast Symphony Rehearsal Hall beginning at 8:30 p.m.

The concert will be performed by eight of the eleven members of the Festival faculty with one assisting artist.

Program for the evening, as planned by Director Paul Wolfe, offers a variety of instrumental performances and composers.

Telemann's Concerto in A Minor, dating from the early eighteenth century, is the opening number performed by flutist Julius Baker, oboist Robert Bloom, pianist Jacques Abram, cellist Gabor Rejto, and violinist Paul Wolfe.

More contemporary is the second selection, Hindemith's Sonata for English Horn and Piano with pianist Abram and Patricia Stenberg, English horn.

Moving back slightly in time, violinists Wolfe and Anita Brooker, violist David Dawson, and cellist Rejto will perform Dvorak's Quartet in F Major, Opus 96.

To wind up the program, Abram, Wolfe, Dawson, Rejto and bassist Gaston Dufresne will do Schubert's Quintet in D Major.

As with all of the concerts of the 1966 Festival, Friday's will be performed in the Florida West Coast Symphony Hall, specially designed for chamber music and completely air conditioned.

Tickets for the performance are on sale at New College, at the Sport Shop in Sarasota, at Hullingers Music Shop in Bradenton, or at the door prior to the concert.
