Sarasota, Fla.--(May 1)--The second New College Summer Music Festival will be held June 19 to July 3 with a number of nationally-known musicians on its faculty and seven public concerts scheduled.

Applications now are being taken for students to participate in the festival during which classes will be offered in strings, piano, woodwinds, brass and solfege.

Emphasis of the festival, as it was during the first year, will be on chamber music.

Returning to the faculty this year will be oboist Robert Bloom, pianist Jacques Abram, violist Walter Trampler, violinist Paul Wolfe, bassist Gaston Dufresne, and woodwinds, Patricia Stenberg.

New to the faculty are flutist Julius Baker, cellists Gabor Rejto and Leslie Parnas, and John Barrows, French horn.

Each of the faculty has performed with outstanding chamber groups and their experience includes national and international concert tours, college and university teaching, and symphony orchestra positions.

Classes are to be held on the New College campus and are open to qualified musicians, either amateur or professional from high school age upward.

The faculty will perform in the seven concerts to be given in the Florida West Coast Symphony Hall, especially designed for chamber programs.

Students may choose either to attend the first or second week or both sessions. There are openings also for auditors, who may attend any of the classes and also the concerts, but who will not perform during the class sessions.
