NEW TELEPHONE SYSTEM INSTALLED

Today (Thursday) is a big day on the campus, with the cooperation of the General Telephone Company. This marks the opening of the new telephone switchboard in Hamilton Center on the East Campus. Under its temporary system, in operation since the move to the campus four and one-half years ago, most offices have worked through a central switchboard, but not all. Now a full-scale reception center for stu-

dents and guests will be housed in the new building and almost all offices of the college will be linked through a central communications system. Confusion should be rampant for a few days until the campus community becomes accustomed to new extension numbers and those off campus learn of the new college-wide number, 355-7131.

LIVE MUSIC FOR STUDENTS

In the new class term that began this week, New College students again have the opportunity to gain part of their education through the medium of live performances. A string quartet will perform for first-year students every Tuesday morning at 8:30 a.m., assisting in teaching the musical portion of the basic humanities program. This term, the quartet will perform mostly music by twentieth century composers, but with a gradual transition from the last term studies of Baroque music. Playing for the early hour classes will be Professor Paul Wolfe, David Cohen, Anita Brooker, and Christopher von Baeyer.

Professor Wolfe has completed arrangements to take part for the tenth time in the annual Casals Festival in San Juan, Puerto Rico, beginning May 28. Wolfe is the principal second violinist for the orchestra which consists of members of major U. S. symphony orchestras. He has received special permission to leave the Casals Festival early to return here for the opening of the New College Summer Music Festival, opening June 11 for three weeks.
