ALLIANCE DELEGATES REPORT

Dr. Corinne G. Wilson and Woodruff W. Bryne, New College delegates to the second annual Florida-Colombia Alliance Conference in Barranquilla, Colombia last week, report a busy and successful series of meetings. Other area delegates to the conference were Dr. Kermit Johnson and Miss Letitia Silver of Manatee Junior College. Reports at the conference told of many projects of mutual assistance between Florida and Colombia. Seventy Colombian students studied in colleges and universities in Florida on scholarships. A ton of books was provided to the Universidad del Norte. Florida students are studying and working in Colombia under the exchange program. The list extended into the fields of medicine, agriculture, civic organizations, and especially Sister Cities, with some 12 Florida cities now having ties to Colombian cities. New College received special attention in the conference report noting the 16 members of the campus community who have visited Colombia on a variety of work and study projects. Secretary of State Tom Adams made one of the opening addresses at the conference. Adams was the founder of the Alliance.

LIBRARY BUS SHUTTLE

The University of South Florida's library is much larger in space, in number of volumes and in staff than New College's and from the inception of the New College library, great cooperation has flowed from the Tampa institution. Some of New College's volumes were stored in the USF space until stacks were completed here on campus. An inter-library loan service has been in existence for several years so that books may be ordered by students at New College and sent down for limited periods. During the current Independent Study Period, groups of students go up to USF campus once a week to use the facilities there and to work up lists of books they need to use later for their research projects. The students go up immediately after breakfast and return in time for dinner. A student-driven van takes the group for the library days.
