SARASOTA - - A Catholic educator from the Dominican Republic renewed friendships on the New College campus Thursday and brought greetings to the college from his country.

Padre Agrepino Nunez, vice rector of the Universidad Catolica Madre y Maestra in Santiago, spent yesterday touring the campus and lunching with faculty, students and staff of the college.

Padre Nunez, who is beginning a tour of American colleges and universities, met again Mrs. John Elmendorf, wife of the New College president, who spent several weeks in the Dominican Republic in the spring under the auspices of the State Department, and with student Tom Todd, who spent his independent study period in Santiago, also this past spring.

Another interested student at the luncheon was first year student Steve Nohlgren of Coral Gables who will be in residence during the next academic year at the University in Santiago. Steve has been awarded a scholarship for study there and he also has been given a teaching assistantship in English.

After leaving Sarasota Thursday, Padre Nunez flew to Houston to visit Rice University and then he will visit, in turn, Texas A & M., St. Louis University, Notre Dame University and New York University before returning to the Dominican Republic in late July.
