Dr. William Arrowsmith, a classics professor who believes a hope for liberal arts colleges is in changing the emphasis of undergraduate teaching, will be the speaker at the Friday Night Forum immediately after the evening meal tonight (May 19). His talk is entitled "Toward the New University."

A Rhodes Scholar, Woodrow Wilson and Guggenheim Fellow, winner of the Prix de Rome, best known for his translations of Euripides plays, Dr. Arrowsmith is now teaching at Wesleyan University's Institute for Advanced Studies, and he has taught at Princeton, California, and the University of Texas.

He objects to the demands of graduate schools dictating the course of study the undergraduate should take. He also speaks to the stultifying effect on teaching exerted by graduate schools.
