SARASOTA--Summer programs of study in France are available this year to students of college level in cooperation with New College, it was announced today.

Openings are available for study at the Institute for American Universities at Aix-en-Provence, France, in the areas of intensive French language and literature, fine arts, or European civilization and politics.

The institute is chartered by the University of the State of New York, operated under French law under the auspices of the University of Aix-Marseille, a state university of France founded in 1409. The institute, located 17 miles north of Marseille, serves as a recognized center for overseas study for more than 280 American colleges and universities.

The summer program operates from June 29 to August 12. Students may be housed in university dormitories and take meals in the university dining halls.

In addition to the summer program, there also are semester and year programs available nearby in Avignon.

A number of New College students are taking advantage of the summer and the year-long program. Alfred Scheinberg will be in the

fine arts summer workshop program and Ann Lake will take the course in European civilization. Both are taught in English.

George Duffee-Braun, Barbara Sieborowska and Kathleen Capels all will study French and French literature during the 1968-69 academic year. Richard Foster will study psychology and Patricia Cole will study modern European literature during the year.

Kenneth Moore, a second year New College student, presently is there working on a political science project studying the rise of de Gaulle in France.
